STATEWIDE CAMPOUT RULES

- NKCC is off limits to everyone except for one leader per church to register for the church.
- There is a District-wide policy that ALL adults need an Adult Verification form.
 Adults will not be allowed to camp without an Adult Verification Form. <u>Photocopied</u> signatures will not be accepted.
- All visitors must register when they arrive and leave the camp after the evening service.
- Any boy who does not have a Medical Release form AND Permission From will not be allowed to be in any activities.
- No one should enter another campsite without permission from that Church's Leader.
- Absolutely no horseplay through the campgrounds.
- All boys must travel in a group outside their campsites with either a leader or friend. (Practice the rule of 3)
- All boys using tools on camp craft items must have a current Tool Craft Safety card in their possession. (If going for Camping Award)
- No radios, tape players, boom boxes, cell phones, IPods, computers or video games are permitted.
- No firearms (even toys) allowed except in designated events.
- No playing with fire. All fires <u>must be</u> completely extinguished at night and when the group leaves the campsite.
- EVERYONE is required to attend ALL events, services and assemblies (1 leader may stay back to keep fire going or prep meals.)
- All injuries / illness or anyone needing medical attention must be reported to the First Aid station at NKCC.
- The Group Leader in charge is responsible for conduct and safety and have knowledge where his boys are at all times.

- Vehicles cannot be loaded during the Sunday morning assembly. Vehicles will not be permitted in the campground until after the service is over.
- Everyone must exhibit the conduct and attitude of Christ at ALL times.
- No smoking, alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs are allowed at the camp.
- Firewood from outside the camp <u>IS NOT</u> permitted.
- Excess firewood should be neatly stacked next to a tree.
- Burn all food scraps, paper and other burnable items. Non-burnable trash MUST be carried out with the Church or put in the camp dumpster (<u>Only one bag per church</u> <u>may be placed in the camp dumpster</u>.) Non-burnable trash must not be buried at The Woods at Lake Placid Campgrounds under any circumstance.
 - Trash dumpster: burn tin can interiors dry, then squash cans flat; recycle all beverage cans; all trash must be in sealed plastic bags.
- Grounds should be policed for litter and disposed of before it has a chance to accumulate. Clean fire pit of metal, glass or tin foil before departure.
- Biodegradable soap should only be used.
- Tree and brush cutting will not be permitted without prior approval from District Staff.
 No carving or chopping of live trees is permitted. Chain saws are not to be used after 3:00 PM on Friday.
- All boats or canoes must be launched from a designated area only. All users must wear life jackets. Abide by all water safety regulations.
- Report any damage done to the camp to the District Staff.
- All sport activities must be conducted in the open field by the Assembly area.
- Boys may not be allowed to return to the campsite during the Saturday activities.
